**Pine Springs Rendezvous to be Held October 11-13**

Save the date for the Second Annual Pine Springs Rendezvous at Seed Saver's Exchange!

The Rendezvous is an annual event loosely organized by the state council to celebrate the end of the workday and fair-weather fishing season. The three day event is held at Seed Saver's Exchange just north of Decorah on Columbus Day weekend each year, and we invite TU members from chapters around the Driftless to come fish Iowa waters for a weekend.

SSE will allow TU members to camp on the farm along Pine Springs Creek throughout the weekend. The campground opens Friday night. On Saturday morning we'll have a solid breakfast, followed by a brief workday. This year we'll be tackling some invasive species sites and hand-cutting the path for a new handicapped-accessible trail along the stream. The workday is "lightweight" (volunteers generally need only gloves and a water bottle) and we'll be done by noon. A big lunch will be served, and in the afternoon Iowa TU volunteers will take our out-of-state visitors out to learn some new waters. For those that are interested, SSE will conduct a tour of the restored water on the farm, as well as the farm operations. We'll organize a Saturday evening dinner for the campers.

On Sunday, we'll venture out again to Iowa waters, and we hope to have some of our friends from Minnesota down to guide trips to their (now open until October 15) waters. Sunday evening dinner will be on your own. SSE will let us camp Sunday evening as well, and we'll pack out and venture out for one more round of fishing Monday morning.

If you're interested in attending the event, email Brett Lorenzen ([chair@iowatu.org](mailto:chair@iowatu.org)) so that he can pass along head counts for camping and food. Specify how many people will be coming for Saturday, and if camp sites are desired, how many people and tents we need to make room for, and on which nights.

Additional details will appear on the October newsletter. Those who contact Brett will receive specific updates on camping and parking as the date approaches.

## **Workday Reminder: Knotweed on Paint Creek, September 24 and 27**

There are two remaining workdays this year to address Japanese Knotweed on Paint Creek: Wednesday, September 24 and Saturday, September 27. We really need a good turnout for these final workdays. At this point, it is largely a matter of apply chemicals to the plants that have been cut back to kill the roots and rhizomes. If the plants are all treated before winter, they could come back again next year.

If you can make it for either day, the help will be appreciated.

Volunteers will meet in the parking lot across the street from the Waterville Lutheran Church, 101 Main Street, Waterville, Iowa 52170. Work days run from 8:00 am through noon. Please bring work gloves, bug spray, water, sun screen and a smile. ## **Fall Driftless Project Tour set for Wednesday, October 15**

Driftless Project tours have been popular and full-to-capacity each of the past several years. In a comfortable charter bus and several trailing vehicles, we set out from a starting point along the Mississippi and visit project sites in at least two states. Costs are picked up by TUDARE (although contributions to cover expenses are always welcomes) and a sumptuous box lunch is provided.



October 15 is this year's project tour, and this year we will feature projects from the Southern Driftless Area in Iowa, Wisconsin and Minnesota. You'll travel with fisheries professionals, project designers, contractors, biologists, engineers, ecologists, landowners and volunteers. It's a great time for dialogue and questions, with the folks who did the project fielding your questions.

Our tour will begin in either Prairie du Chien WI or Lansing Iowa, and we will straddle the river. Expect to see autumn foliage, migrating waterfowl and other birds, and a host of people who are driving the craft of watershed restoration as TUDARE moves into its second decade.

Expect a full day of travel, rain or shine. We should be starting by 9 a.m. and concluding by 5,

but as veteran tourers know, it sometimes takes a bit longer.

This year we have an added bonus: TU's Western Watershed staff will be joining us from their staff retreat site at Cedar Valley Resort near Whalan, MN. About 25-30 fisheries professionals will be adding their input as we travel, as they learn about these marvelous spring creeks across the Driftless Area.

All that means you should sign up early because there will be limited space.
